

CLOTHING SUPPLEMENT

JUDGING PROCEDURES

Members are informed of judging a few weeks before judging (4-H Calendar, email, Facebook, Advisors). At the judging location, members are to go to a designated location and register at the respective table for their project. All entries of a project will be judged at the same time. The judge will evaluate the project inside and out and give the grade of A, B, or C. Members must be present at the Fashion Revue to be eligible for award competition. **The Narration Card must be turned into the OSU Extension Office by July 1st. We must have it to be prepared for the Style Revue. The card will be read when the member is on the stage modeling his/her project.**

FASHION REVUE

All members are eligible to participation in the Fashion Revue which takes place after all projects have been judged. This is where the member will model his/her project on stage. The Honor & County winners will be announced in each category.

At the end of the evening, all County Winners in projects eligible for the Ohio State Fair will return to the stage and compete for Ohio State Fair selection. All judges work together in selecting the Ohio State Fair participants and award nominees. No more than one Ohio State Fair participant will be selected in each class. A participant may be eligible in multiple classes if the judges feel necessary. Attendance at any of the clothing workshops will be used as a tie-breaker.

PROJECT MEMBER BASICS

Clothing projects are labeled as beginner, intermediate, or advanced levels. These levels refer to the previous knowledge needed to successfully complete the project, not the age of the member. However, there are some projects selected for Ohio State Fair competition that are determined by age level. The following project levels serve as a guide in deciding on project levels:

Beginner Level: Little or no experience in project areas OR 8–10-year-olds.

Intermediate Level: Some experience in project areas OR 11–13-year-olds.

Advanced Level: Experienced in project areas OR 14-year-olds and older.

Ohio State Fair age levels:

Junior Level: Ages 8-10 or 8-13 as listed below

Senior Level: Age 11+ or Age 14+ as listed below

*Please note that once you move to the next level in a clothing project, members cannot go back down in skill levels.

- Will serve on the board beginning next year.
- Must have had at least three (3) years in clothing or food nutrition projects.
- Members must be currently enrolled in a clothing or food nutrition project.
- At least ten (10) members will serve on the board.
- Qualified members are to apply at project judging.
- Candidates will be interviewed at judging.
- Selection will be made by Fashion and Food Board Advisors.
- Board members will be notified by mail/email.

DUTIES:

- Assist with county clinics or workshops conducted.
- Assist with county judging.
- Demonstrate to other 4-H'ers: modeling, fashion clues, clothing construction or food preparation, menu planning, and nutrition information.
- The County Fashion Board representative for the Ohio State Fair will be selected from the County Fashion Food Board Members.
