2022 WILLIAMS COUNTY 4-H SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

Background and Purpose

Williams County 4-H Scholarships were established in 2002 to help young people continue their efforts toward becoming self-directing, productive, and contributing members of society. The number of scholarships and amounts will be determined each year by the Williams County Endowment Committee.

Selection Procedures and Criteria

All applicants are eligible who:

- Have attained the academic rank of high school senior, college freshman, college sophomore, or college junior; and
- Are current or former Williams County 4-H member for a minimum of four years; and
- Are pursuing any post-secondary education; and
- Are entering any field of study the following academic year.
- Past applicants and recipients may re-apply as eligible.
- Applicants must use the 2022 application template in order for the application to be considered.

To apply for this award, members need to complete:

- Include a **photograph**, mounted with rubber cement or rolled tape on a separate sheet of paper with applicant's name. This photo is used for publicity purposes and should be an actual photo not a scanned copy.
- > Complete the Ohio 4-H Achievement Record Must be stapled in the upper left corner.
- Submit 4-H Story shared how 4-H contributed to your personal development, leadership skills, and/or career plans (single-sided, double-spaced personal, typed in Arial 11 point font and limited to two (2) pages.)
- Submit 4-H Pictures show growth and experiences of 4-H involvement in photos (one-page and on one side only.)
- Potential for Success describe what your potential career and successes are on your horizon.
- A current transcript of your grades with a school administrator or official signature and complete the other educational information requested in the application.
- Financial Need Information limited to one page by completing the information requested.
- Financial Need Information Statement explain how you plan on paying for a college education, explain a special family circumstances, include any work/study opportunities, and financial assistance from family members, grants, scholarships etc. (double spaced).
- ➤ Work Experience explain any type of work experience you have performed now or in the past at home, on the farm or a job in business/industry.
 - A one-page **Letter of Support** from a past or present 4-H Club Advisor (non-family member expected).

- Applications must be completed and submitted to the OSU Extension Williams
 County office by the deadline: January 7, 2022.

The awards and their presentations

Williams County 4-H Scholarship winner(s) will be publicly recognized at a county 4-H recognition program. In addition, scholarship winners will receive their scholarship monies sometime after their first grading period in college following selection. Recipients must submit a transcript from their first grading period, proving a minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.5 and "full time" status. The monies will be credited to the appropriate college admissions office where it is applied directly to the cost of the recipient's college fees. The scholarship is to be re-paid in full if the recipient does not successfully complete the year of college education. Scholarships must be used within the first 12 months following the announcement of awarding.
