#### State 4-H Fashion Board

- Promote Ohio 4-H clothing program and assist at the Ohio State Fair Fashion Revue
- One year term; preference to teens ages 14+

#### 4-H Educational Youth Assistants

- Assist and represent Ohio 4-H at Ohio State Fair events; ages 13-18

#### Teen Leadership Council

- Statewide group of 4-H teens that provide a youth stakeholder perspective for Ohio 4-H while developing skills for future success
- One year term (may renew for additional years); ages 14-18

# **EDUCATIONAL EXPERIENCES**

#### Ohio 4-H Conference

- Day-long conference designed to engage teens in educational sessions pertaining to leadership, 4-H opportunities, and current events
- Held annually in Columbus (virtually in 2021);
  ages 13+

#### Ohio Youth Capital Challenge

- Learn how to make a difference through public policy and action
- Hosted each spring/summer; ages 14-18 and grades 9-12

#### Buckeye Leadership Workshop

- This 5 day event focuses on experiential learning through recreation to learn, share, and grow
- Held annually in March in central Ohio; ages 14+, will next be held in March 2022

#### • Citizenship Washington Focus

- Held in Washington, D.C (virtually in 2021), this one-week experience develops students communication, leadership, and citizenship skills.
