Spring Kick-Off

New Volunteer Applications

Adults interested in becoming a 4-H volunteer must complete an application, interview process, a BCI background check and attend a volunteer training in 2019. To be accepted as a 4-H volunteer for 2019, all required pieces must be complete by March 1, 2019. Volunteers can still apply after this date, but the application process will not be completed until the fall of 2019. Applications can be found on the web site at http://williams.osu.edu (under 4-H Youth Development, Advisor Info) or picked up at the office.

Volunteers, please re-enroll for 2018-2019 in the Ohio 4-H online database at https://oh4honline.com. When you login, you'll need to under Family, click "Edit" and then click to re-enroll. Be sure that your contact information is correct and that you sign the Standards of Behavior. We'll then have to approve you in the system before you can access your Club information. Please get this done ASAP possible so that you can help your club members get reenrolled. Call the office with any questions you may have.

Animal Science Projects

2019 Livestock Quality Assurance (LQA)

All youth planning to exhibit market animals or animals that produce marketable byproducts (eggs, milk, etc.) are required to attend annual LQA training or pass an LQA test (if applicable) each year. This includes beef, sheep,

Youth not completing the LQA requirement in 2019 will not be able to exhibit at the 2019 Ohio State fair or 2019 Williams County Fair with livestock. The deadline to complete a Livestock Quality Assurance is June 1st 2019.

Poultry Quality Assurance

Williams County is partnering with Henry and Fulton Counties where Dr. Tim McDermott is going to be presenting a Poultry Quality Assurance/Clinic **April 11th 6-8pm** (location to be announced soon). This will be quality assurance specific to the poultry members so please plan to attend this session to complete Quality Assurance 2019.*If you also enroll in and exhibit other animals, this QA will count as completion. Testing Out of Livestock Quality Assurance

Youth may test out of the Quality Assurance Training by completing a 50 question test. Those with 70% or higher will not need to attend annual training. Tests are available for youth ages 12-14 and 15-18 as of January 1.

February 12 at 6pm and March 12 at 6pm are the two test-out dates. RSVP to ford.806@osu.edu by Monday, February 11 for the 2/12 date and RSVP by March 11 for the 3/12 date. Youth who do not pass the test will then still have ample time to attend a 2019 LQA date.

Horse Quality Assurance

If you are taking a horse project, make plans to attend Horse Quality Assurance on **Saturday, March 16** from 9am-11am. Location is will be announced and soon as it's finalized. At this training, first year project members will also be able to watch the required Horse Safety Video.

Horse Royalty Applications

Tuesday, April 11th, Horse Royalty Applications are due to the Extension office. Applications may be found online at https://williams.osu.edu/horse. Horse Royalty Interviews are Saturday, April 20th at 9:00am the Williams County Fairgrounds, Horse Arena.
